

Guidelines for Poster presentations

Preparing your poster

Make sure your poster accurately reflects the abstract you originally submitted.

There are no strict rules regarding poster preparation; your subject matter, imagination and display area will provide a better guide. However, there are some general points which you may wish to consider when planning your poster display:

- Colour will draw attention to the poster;
- Try to create an uncluttered design to emphasise the subject matter;
- Divide the content of your poster into appropriate sections;
- Ensure font size or lettering is large enough to read from a certain distance;
- Use larger lettering for the poster's title, author and institutional affiliation;
- Text should be brief and concise;
- Graphs, charts and tables are particularly eye-catching on posters;
- Try to create a straightforward organisation or flow;
- Make sure the poster's concept is clear and can be easily understood even if you, the presenter, are not standing beside the display.

Transporting your poster

- You will need to bring your poster with you and take it away with you after your poster session. Please do not send it in advance!
 - Consider printing your poster on a fabric or textile rather than cardboard – this will significantly facilitate transport to and from the venue, especially if you are flying to Italy.
 - If you prefer to print your poster on cardboard, a mailing tube or portfolio case is recommended for transporting your poster.
- You may want to bring with you A4 copies of your poster and/or hand-outs with the main points of your presentation to give out to interested delegates;
- A notepad may prove helpful in elaborating further upon your poster or for taking names and addresses of delegates interested in your work.

Setting up your poster

- Each poster presentation will be allocated one display board in the *Dehor room* (please see the floor plan in the last page of this document);
- The dimensions of each board are 100cm wide x 250cm high – please make sure your poster does not exceed these measurements;
- ALTE will provide materials to attach the posters to the boards;
- You will be fully responsible for setting up, monitoring and removing your poster after your allocated session;
- **Posters cannot be sent in advance, and we cannot return any posters which have not been removed;**
- Your poster presentation has been allocated a half-day slot in the conference programme. This means the posters need to be set up before the beginning of this slot, and removed immediately afterwards. Please read the tables below carefully for details regarding the setting up and removal times for each poster session.

Displaying your poster

- Delegates will have the chance to look at your poster throughout the whole half-day poster presentation slot.
- You are only required to stand by your poster during the corresponding break in each half-day slot. Again, set-up, presentation and removal times for each poster session are indicated below.
- Presentation times are during the breaks. Breaks will be 45-minute long. Delegates will be free to walk from poster to poster during this time. You will have a few minutes to present your poster to each group that gathers, followed by a few minutes to discuss, take questions and respond to comments.
